## **Discussion Questions**

After reading the article, consider the following questions:

- 1. Describe the difference between a photograph being an exchange, a performance, or a selectively rendered reality. \*
- 2. In the article Resnick states, "The art I make is a reflection of what I want to see." As a class, discuss the quote as it relates to the three images provided in the article.
- 3. The period explored in the exhibition is 1973 to 1982, when Resnick experimented with conceptual photography.
